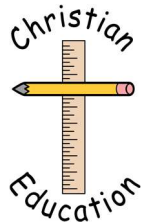
## Naomi's Corner

## Water Project Update

At long last, we have positive forward progress on this project.

A quick recap: We asked IRC in a 3-way project (Epic Mission, Schacht OJ and CCC) to bring county water to our facilities. IRC finally agreed.

We hired MBV to engineer our project. The plan was to bring water from 58<sup>th</sup> Ave. and 12<sup>th</sup> St. to our three properties. The project was stalled because of the intense work that would be required to 'tap into the line' under 58<sup>th</sup>. We then asked First Church of God to give us an easement on their property to tap into their 8" main. They agreed but were in a campus construction project. Their plans have been finalized. MBV has completed new plans and it HAS BEEN SUBMITTED TO IRC and should be approved soon. We have sent our project to 3 companies and are awaiting bids. After receiving the bids, the 3 parties (Epic, Schacht & CCC) will meet and make our selection based on price and how quickly the work can begin. Please keep this process in prayer for God's favor.
